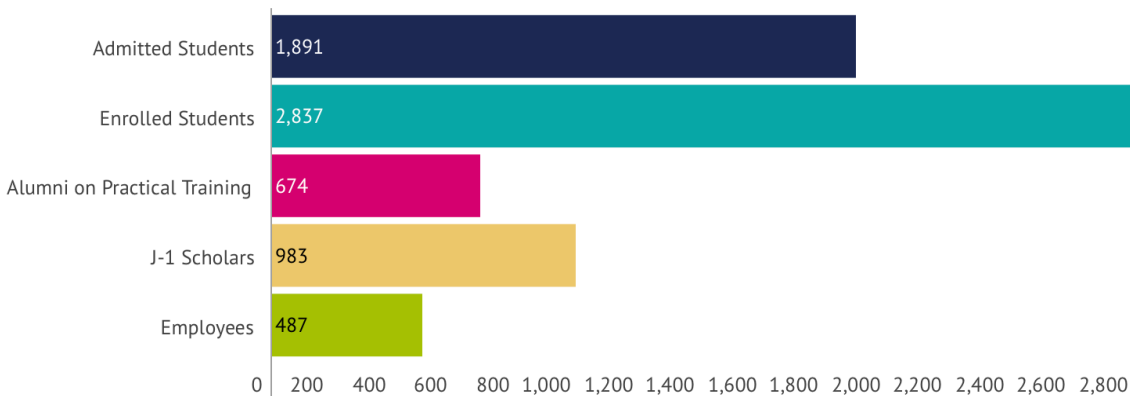

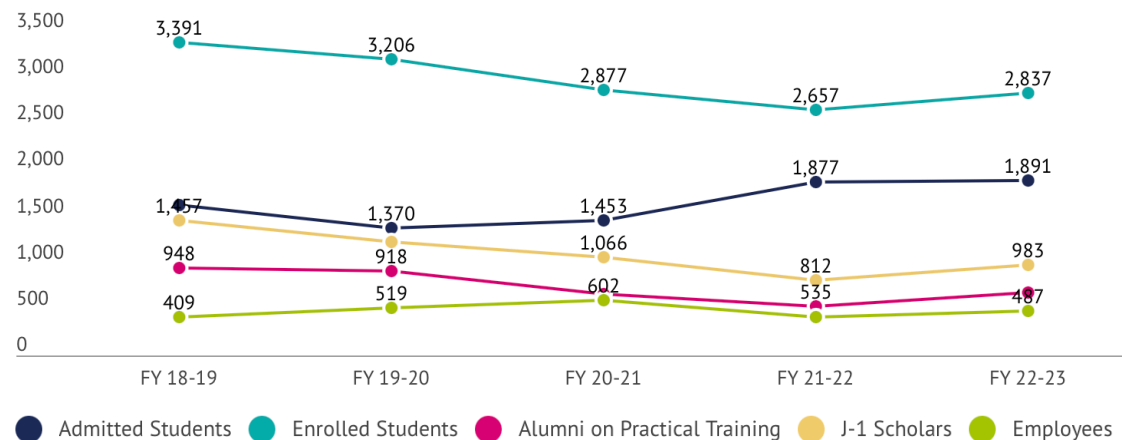
International Populations

Fall 2022 (Enrolled Students) or FY 22-23 (All Others)



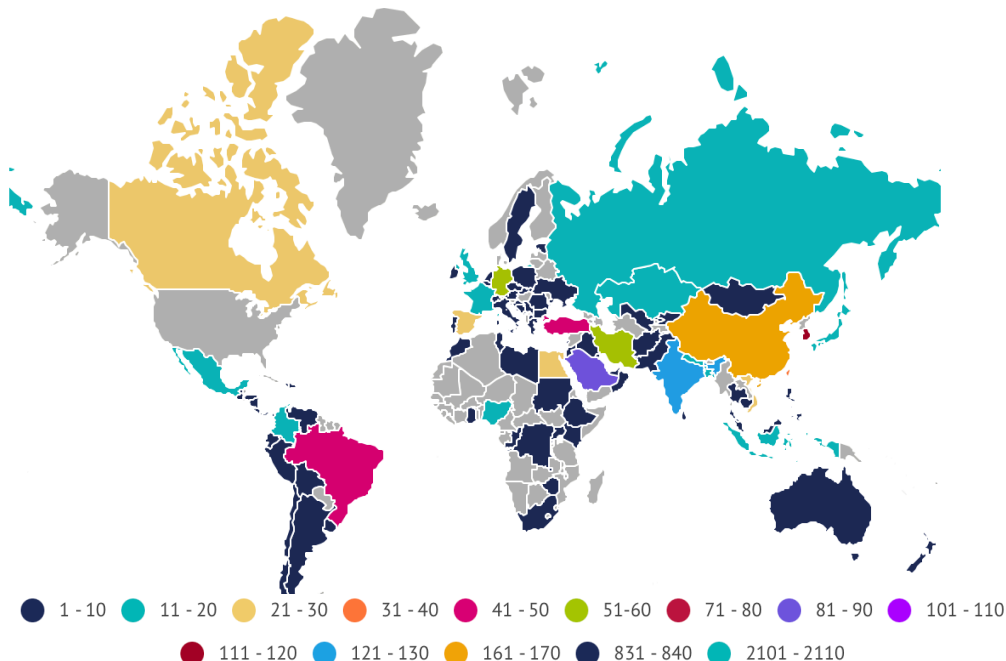
International Populations

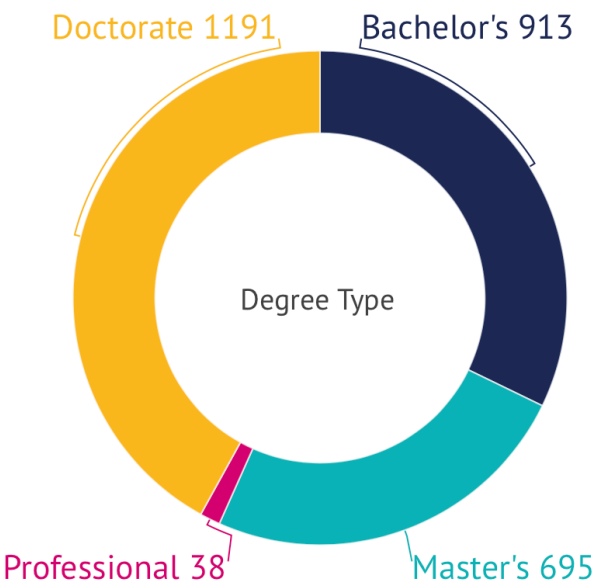

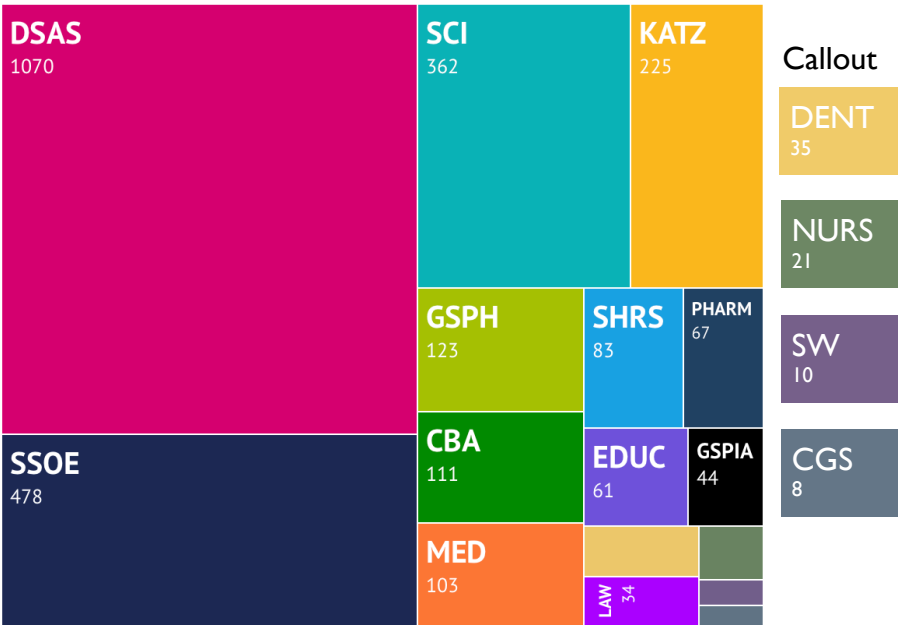

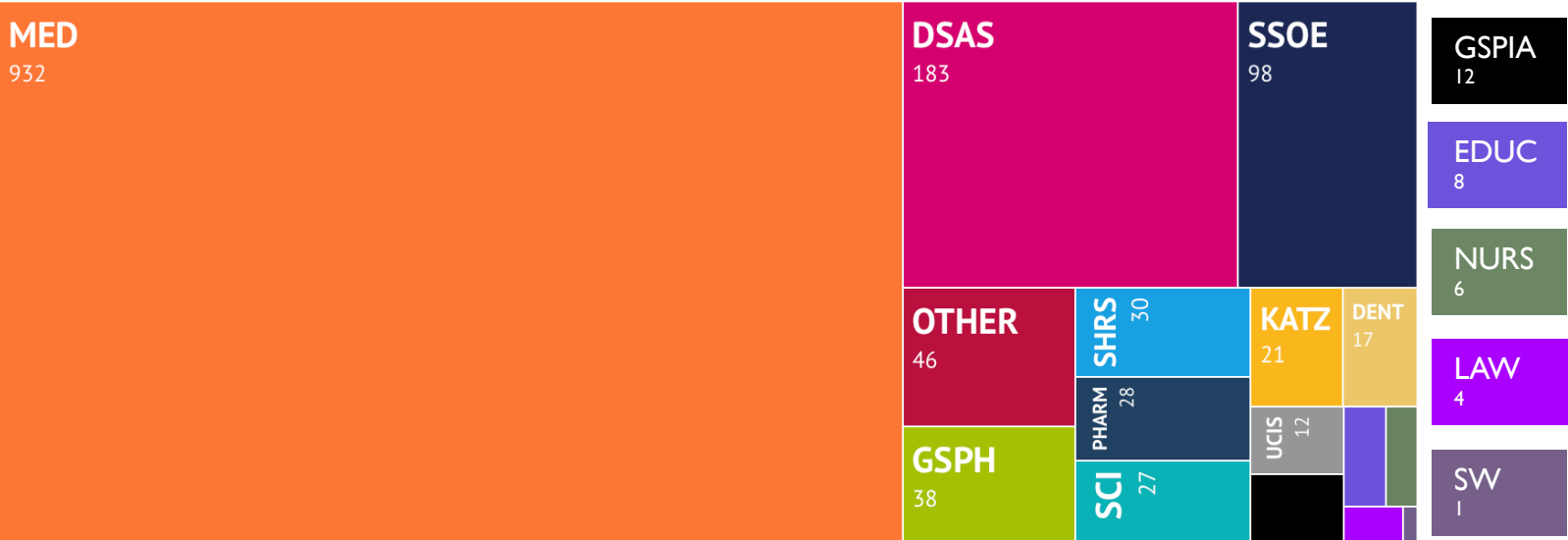
By Degree Type
