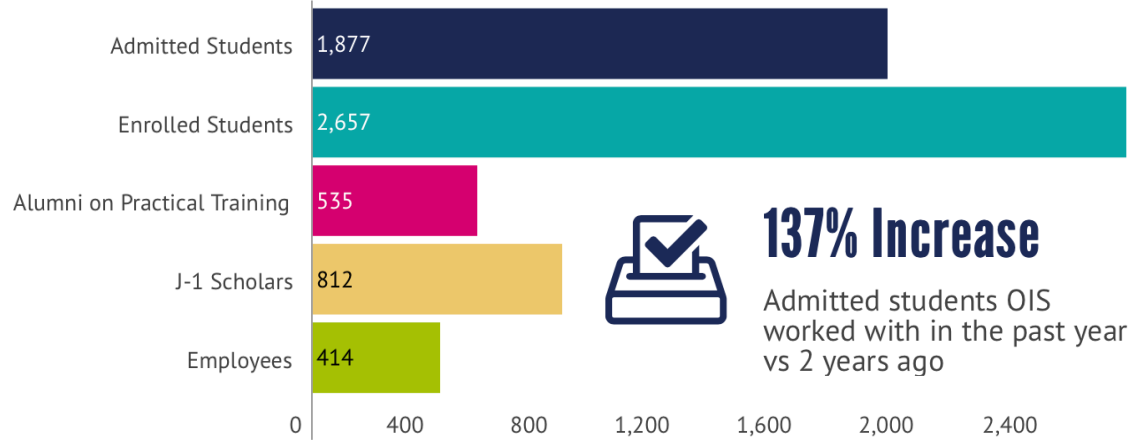

Fall 2021 (Enrolled Students) or FY 21-22 (All Others)

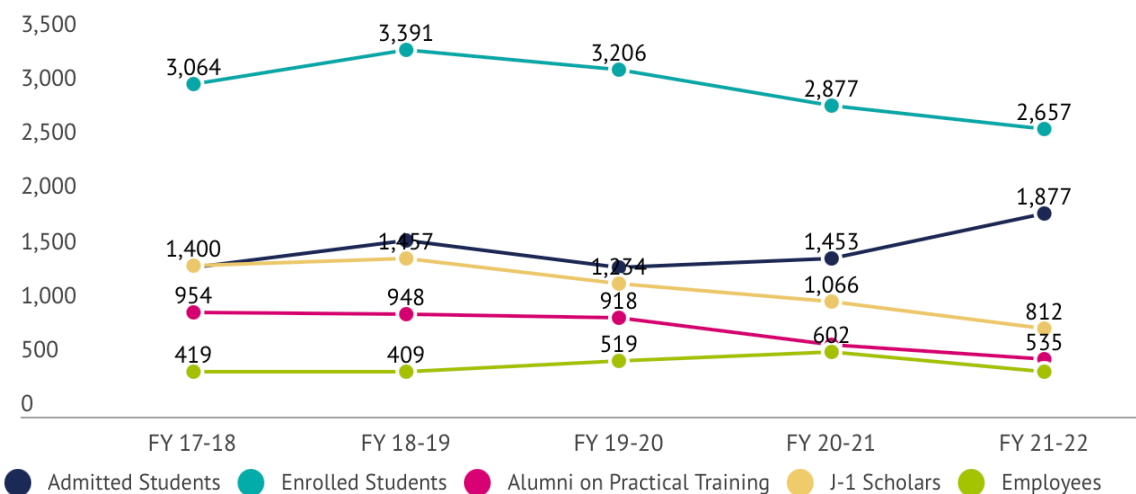


In FY 2021-2022, Pitt hosted international students, scholars, and employees from **114 countries.**



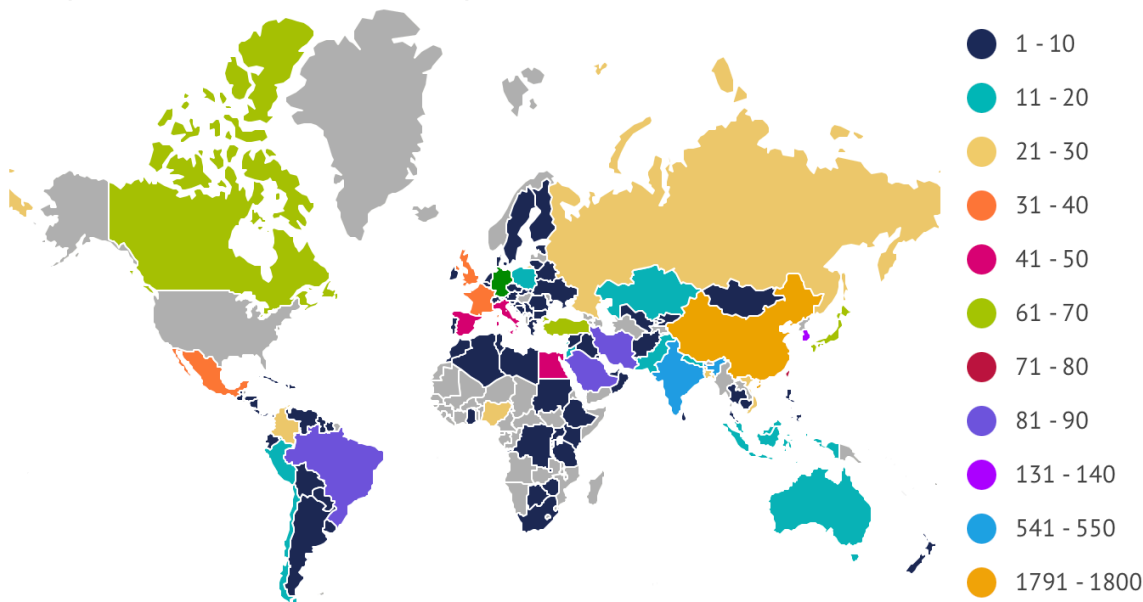
International Populations

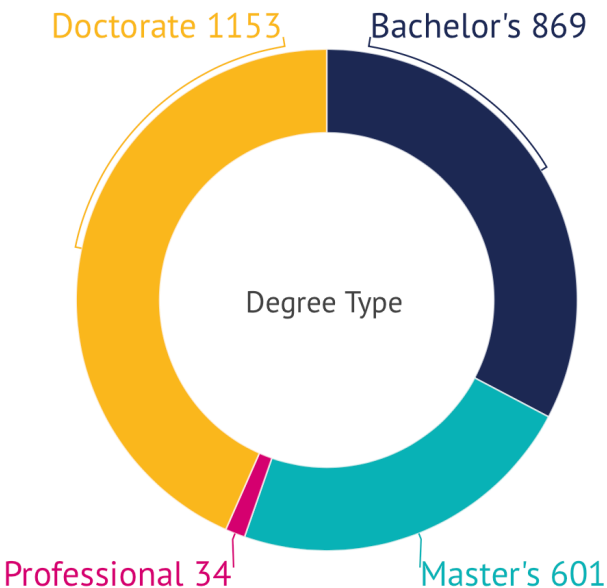

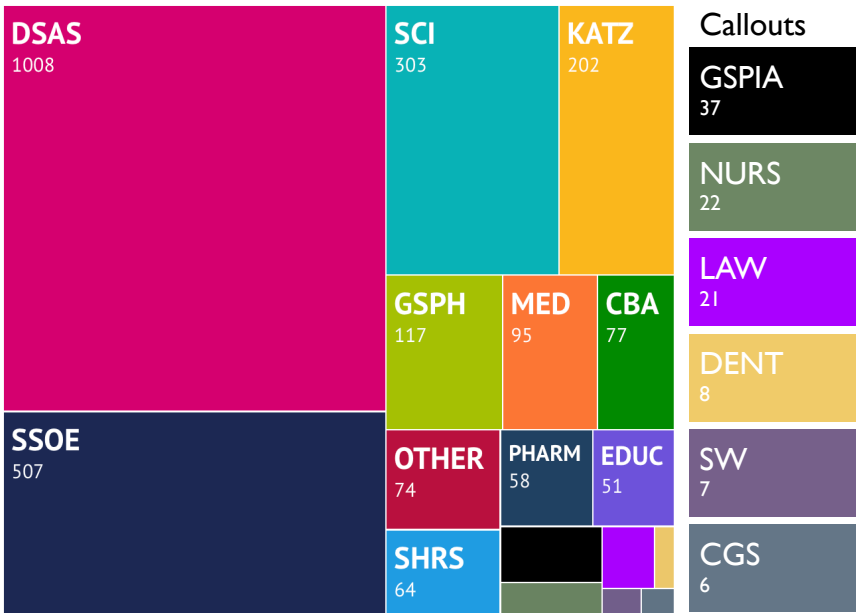

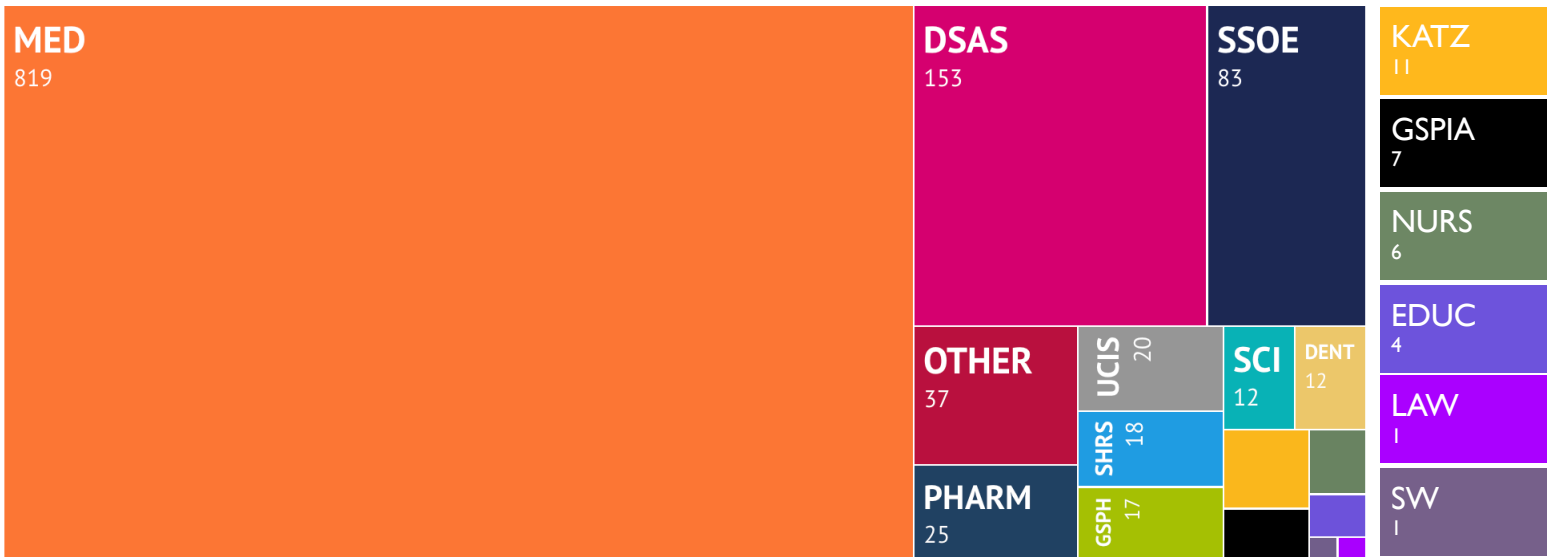
By Degree Type

A Look at 2021 - 2022

The 2021 – 2022 year brought a slow return back to normal on Pitt’s campus – classes were held in person, students were living in residence halls, receptions were held, and important events were celebrated.
