Enrolling Your Child in School

All children living in Pennsylvania have the right to a free, public school education. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania operates public elementary, middle and high schools. Children begin Kindergarten at age 5 and are enrolled in school through the 12th grade and generally graduate at the age of 18. In Pennsylvania, attendance at school is compulsory for children ages 8 to 17.

Enrollment

To enroll your child in school, you will need the following:

- Proof of the child's age
- Proof of address
- Immunization records in English
