Enrollment Requirements for F-1 & J-1 International Students

The federal government has specific enrollment requirements for students in F-1 and J-1 status. You must understand these requirements as you start, continue, and plan to finish your academic program.

Definition of "full-time" enrollment at Pitt:

Undergraduate:	12 credits, or co-op enrollment
Graduate / Professional:	9 credits, co-op enrollment, or full-time dissertation (FTD)

Basic requirements:

- Must be enrolled full-time in your first term of study
- Must be enrolled full-time each Fall and Spring term, unless it is your final term (see below)
- No enrollment requirements for Summer term, *unless* summer is your last term, or *if* your academic program requires it

Final term requirements (applicable to Fall, Spring, & Summer terms):

- Must be enrolled at Pitt during your final term
- Cannot exceed the limits on online credits (see below)
- Part-time enrollment is possible after receiving OIS approval (see below)
 - o **Note**: if you only enroll in one course for your final term, it cannot be an online course
- If you will enroll for a portion of your final term, then OIS will shorten your I-20 / DS-2019 end date to the last day of classes for that portion of the term, for example:
 - o Students who enroll in the 1st 6 week session of the Summer term
 - Katz Graduate School of Business students who enroll in the 1st 8 week session of a term
- If you complete your program requirements *before* the end date that is currently listed on your I-20 or DS-2019, OIS will shorten your I-20 or DS-2019 to the end date of your final term / session

Online credits:

- Only 3 online credits can count toward a student's full-time enrollment each term
 - Examples of students maintaining immigration status with online credits:
 - A graduate student with 3 online credits out of 9 total credits
 - An undergraduate student with 3 online credits out of 12 total credits
 - Examples of students violating immigration status with online credits:
 - A graduate student with 6 online credits out of 9 total credits
 - An undergraduate student with 6 online credits out of 12 total credits
- Hybrid courses are considered as "in-person" courses, since there is a physical presence requirement

Acceptable reasons to drop below full-time enrollment:

- OIS can authorize a student to drop below full-time enrollment for very specific reasons.
- OIS authorization must take place before the student withdraws from the course(s):

Reason:	Eligible Term:
<u>Illness or Medical Condition</u>	Any term
To Complete Course of Study in Current Term	Final term only
Unfamiliarity with American Teaching Methods*	First term only
Initial Difficulty with Reading Requirements*	First term only
Initial Difficulty with the English Language*	First term only
Improper Course Level Placement*	First term only
